An American Brilliant Period cut glass dealer show will be held in the Dorflinger Cutting Shop at the Dorflinger Factory Museum on Saturday and Sunday. The show will feature five outstanding cut glass dealers. The glass dealer show is sponsored and vetted by the American Cut Glass Association.

2022 Special Exhibits at the Dorflinger Factory Museum

"Dorflinger Color!"

This special exhibit includes some of the finest examples of Dorflinger's work in color beginning in the 1850s in Brooklyn and continuing through the Brilliant Period (1876-1917). Most American Brilliant Period cut glass was made in colorless glass, making examples in color quite rare. The exhibit includes the earliest known example of Dorflinger glass, a Dorflinger family punch bowl believed to have been made by Christian Dorflinger in France. Also included are rare examples of multi-color stemware. Many of the objects in this exhibit are on loan from four private collections, making this a rare opportunity to see some of Dorflinger's finest color work in a single exhibit.

"Ulysses S. Grant."

This exhibit celebrates the life and accomplishments of President Grant, with a particular focus on First Lady Julia Dent Grant's decorating and entertaining in the White House. This exhibit includes examples of the glassware service ordered from the Dorflinger Glass Company for the 1874 White House wedding of the Grants' daughter Nellie, as well as the French state porcelain service and a remarkable Rose Medallion export porcelain service ordered by Julia Grant. The exhibit also includes memorabilia from the Grant White House years and from their subsequentWorld Tour. Most of the objects in this exhibit are on loan from an extensive private collection and are rarely seen.
